## **Eligibility Requirements for Undergraduate Admissions**

## Common Minimum Eligibility\*

The candidate must have passed the Class XII or its equivalent examination from a single recognized board.

\*For the purpose of ascertaining the Minimum Eligibility, the marksheet/ degree of only one board will be considered. (For example, If a candidate has appeared in CBSE Board Examination with five subjects except for Mathematics and later appears and passes Mathematics from another board such as the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS), the minimum eligibility shall be ascertained from his/her mark sheet issued by CBSE only).

## B.Com(Hons)

## **Program Specific Eligibility**

Candidates must appear in CUET in any of the following subject combinations:

Combination I: Any one Language from List A + Mathematics/Applied Mathematics + Any two subjects out of which at least one should be from List B1

OR

Combination II: Any one Language from List A + Accountancy/Book Keeping + Any two subjects out of which at least one should be from List B1

Merit will be based on the best CUET scores obtained from any of the above-mentioned combinations of subjects.

## **B.Com**

## **Program Specific Eligibility**

Candidates must appear in CUET in any of the following subject combinations:

Combination I: Any one Language from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2

OF

Combination II: Any one Language from List A + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2 + SECTION III of CUET (General Test)

Merit will be based on the best CUET scores obtained from any of the above-mentioned combinations of subjects. Note: As the weightage of the CUET Sections is not the same, appropriate proration will be done.

## **B.A.**(Hons)Economics

#### **Program Specific Eligibility**

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

Any one Language from List A + Mathematics/Applied Mathematics + Any two subjects out of which one should be from List B1

Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

## **B.Sc(Hons) Computer Science**

#### **Program Specific Eligibility**

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

Any one language from List A + Mathematics/Applied Mathematics + Any two subjects out of which one should be from List B1

Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

## **B.A.(Hons)Business Economics (BBE)**

#### **Program Specific Eligibility**

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

Any one Language from List A + Mathematics/Applied Mathematics + SECTION III of CUET (General Test)

Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

## **Program Specific Eligibility**

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

Any one Language from List A + Mathematics/Applied Mathematics + SECTION III of CUET (General Test)

Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

## B.A.(Hons)Punjabi

## **Program Specific Eligibility**

Candidates must appear in CUET in any of the following subject combinations:

Combination I: Punjabi from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from List B1 or List B2

OR

Combination II: Any one language from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject either from List B1 or List B2

Merit will be based on the best CUET score obtained from any of the above-mentioned combinations of subjects. Candidates who opted for Combination II for admission will be considered only if seats remain vacant after considering all the candidates who opted for Combination I.

#### 2. How do I check which college is offering the course that I am interested in?

#### 3. What is subject mapping and why is it necessary?

Ans. Subject mapping is a mandatory requirement for the application process. This is a requirement wherein the student should have passed the class XII or its equivalent examination from a single recognized board. However, this is not applicable to the General Test.

## 4. Is there any cut-off for admission?

Ans. No, admissions are purely based on CUET score.

## 5. What are the documents required for admission through Sikh Minority?

Ans. Sikh minority certificate issued by DSGMC (not older than 6 months from the date of seeking admission)

#### 6. How admission is done for ECA/Sports category

Ans. Admission under ECA/Sports is done through central DU allocation mechanism

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the supernumerary quota for ECA and/or Sports must appear in CUET (UG) - 2023.

For admissions to ECA and Sports supernumerary seats a weightage of 25% will be given to CUET score and 75% to certificates/trials/performances.

## 7. Is there any separate college form for the ward quota admission?

Ans. No separate form is needed for ward quota. You must select the required option in CSAS form.

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Ward Quota of Employees of University of Delhi must appear in CUET (UG) - 2023.

Admission to the wards of University and its College employees, both teaching and non-teaching will be done as per Academic Council resolution 9 a & b dated 27.11.2020 and subsequent amendments thereof.

Candidates must be in possession of a valid Employment Certificate issued by due officials at the time of registration. Only the Employment certificate uploaded at the time of registration will be considered. I-cards, Aadhar Card and/or any other document will not be accepted.

#### 8. What are the documents needed at the time of admission?

Ans. DU Admission process is completely online.
